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of Ms. SaTae'zja Devereaux at the hands of members of the BART Police Department.

- 2. On December 31, 2019, BART Police Officers Karl Carpio, Casey Tyler, and Brian Lucas stopped Ms. Devereaux as she exited the fare gates at the Bay Fair BART Station for suspicion of fare evasion. After speaking with her for a moment, the Officers forcefully took the young, slender, African American woman down to the ground and then proceeded to physically assault her. The Officers' unwarranted assault caused Ms. Devereaux to vomit and urinate on herself and left her bloody, battered, and bruised.
- 3. Ms. Devereaux's typically uneventful ride home from work on BART turned violent and injurious due to the BART Officers' zeal to physically accost her. Adding insult to injury, the Officers incredulously pressed criminal charges against the young woman—three counts of resisting arrest and one count of fare evasion—and then took Ms. Devereaux to jail, where she was saddled with a \$15,000.00 bail. The absurd criminal charges were later dismissed by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office. Fortunately, the incident was captured on the Officers' body worn cameras.

# **JURISDICTION**

4. This action arises under Title 42 of the United States Code, Section 1983.

Jurisdiction is conferred upon this Court by Title 28 of the United States Code, Sections 1331 and 1343. The unlawful acts and practices alleged herein occurred in the City of San Leandro, in the County of Alameda, California, which is within this judicial district.

## **PARTIES**

- 5. Plaintiff SATAEZJA DEVEREAUX (hereinafter "Plaintiff," or "Ms. Devereaux") is a competent adult of majority age. Until this incident she had never been arrested.
- 6. Defendant KARL L. CARPIO (hereinafter "Defendant") is a competent adult of majority age. He is being sued in his individual and official capacity as a police officer for the

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Bay Area Rapid Transit District (hereinafter "BART").

- 7. Defendant CASEY A. TYLER (hereinafter "Defendant") is a competent adult of majority age. He is being sued in his individual and official capacity as a police officer for the Bay Area Rapid Transit District (hereinafter "BART").
- 8. Defendant BRIAN P. LUCAS (hereinafter "Defendant") is a competent adult of majority age. He is being sued in his individual and official capacity as a police officer for the Bay Area Rapid Transit District (hereinafter "BART").
- 9. Plaintiff is ignorant of the true names and capacities of those Defendants named herein as DOES 1 through 50, inclusive. Plaintiff will amend this Complaint to allege said Defendants true names and capacities when that information becomes known to Plaintiff. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges that DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, are legally responsible and liable for the incident, injuries, and damages hereinafter set forth, and that each of said Defendants proximately caused the injuries and damages by reason of negligent, careless, deliberately indifferent, intentional, or willful misconduct, including the negligent, careless, deliberately indifferent, intentional, willful misconduct in creating and otherwise causing the incidents, conditions, and circumstances hereinafter set forth, or by reason of direct or imputed negligence or vicarious fault or breach of duty arising out of the matters herein alleged. Plaintiff will seek to amend this Complaint to set forth said true names and identities of DOES 1 through 50, inclusive when they have been ascertained.
- 10. Due to the acts and/or omissions alleged herein, Defendants, and each of them, act as the agent, servant, and employee and/or concert with each of said other Defendants herein.

# FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS


11. On December 31, 2019, Plaintiff, 22-year-old Ms. SaTae'zja Devereaux, left her work at an Oakland law firm intent on taking BART to Bay Fair BART station en route to her

home.

12. Ms. Devereaux boarded BART and rode the train to the Bay Fair BART Station.

As she was exiting the station, she was approached by Bart Police Officers Carpio, Tyler, and Lucas.


13. The Defendant Officers accused Ms. Devereaux of the minor citable violation of toll/fare evasion. Officer Carpio proceeded to ask for Ms. Devereaux's identification card. Ms. Devereaux asked if she could simply pay the fare owed; however, Officer Lucas refused her suggestion and told Ms. Devereaux it was too late to rectify the issue. None of the Officers told her why they needed or wanted her to produce her identification. With the ultimate intention of using force, the Officers proceeded to put on their gloves (apparently preparing to attack her) without even explaining to Ms. Devereaux that they intended to give her a ticket for fare evasion.



14. Without warning Ms. Devereaux of their intent to use force nor attempting to deescalate the situation, Officer Tyler suddenly stepped forward and reached out to grab Ms.

Out of fear, Ms. Devereaux recoiled from Officer Tyler's unannounced and physically aggressive approach. Next, Officers Tyler, Carpio, and Lucas immediately jumped onto Ms. Devereaux, who was half their size, and proceeded to violently and forcefully slam her down onto the pavement.






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15. The three Officers placed their body weight on top of Ms. Devereaux and pressed her down on the ground for over seven minutes. The combined weight of the Officers made it extremely difficult for her to breathe. She repeatedly cried out to the three Officers that she was unable to breathe. They ignored her cries.



16. At some point during the incident, Officer Lucas forcefully punched Ms. Devereaux in the face twice. Nevertheless, the Officers continued to hold their body weight on Ms. Devereaux for over three minutes after she was placed in handcuffs. Officer Lucas brazenly proceeded to taunt Ms. Devereaux, as well as the outraged witnesses who were observing and recording the beating. Ms. Devereaux vomited and urinated on herself as a result of the three Officers' use of force.

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17. Ms. Devereaux never attempt to assault or run from any of the Officers during the course of this incident. Indeed, at no point during this incident did Ms. Devereaux pose a credible threat to the three Officers.

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- 18. Ms. Devereaux was treated at the scene for her injuries and then hauled off to Santa Rita Jail. The Officers charged her with three counts of resisting arrest and assaulting a police officer, and one count of fare evasion. Even though Ms. Devereaux had never been arrested before and had no criminal history, she was forced to post a \$15,000.00 bail. Adanté Pointer represented Ms. Devereaux in her criminal case and managed to get all of the criminal charges dismissed.
- 19. As a result of BART Officers Carpio, Tyler, and Lucas' use of force, Ms. Devereaux suffered financial loss, physical injuries, and emotional distress including, but not limited to pain, suffering, and humiliation. To this day, she is haunted by this traumatic incident.

### **DAMAGES**

- 20. As a consequence of Defendants' violations of Plaintiff's federal civil rights under 42 U.S.C. §1983 and the Fourth Amendment, Plaintiff was physically, mentally, emotionally, and financially injured and damaged as a proximate result of Defendants' wrongful conduct.
- 21. Plaintiff found it necessary to engage the services of private counsel to vindicate her rights under the law. Plaintiff is therefore entitled to an award of attorneys' fees and/or costs pursuant to statute(s) in the event that he is the prevailing party in this action under 42 U.S.C. §§ 1983 and 1988. Plaintiff is also entitled to punitive damages under 42 U.S.C. §§ 1983 and 1988.

### **CAUSES OF ACTION**

### FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(Fourth Amendment – Excessive Force under 42 U.S.C. Section 1983) (PLAINTIFF against Defendants CARPIO, TYLER, LUCAS, and DOES 1-50)

Plaintiff hereby re-alleges and incorporates by reference each and every 22.

paragraph of this Complaint. 1 23. The Officers failed to issue a verbal warning to Plaintiff before using force. 2 Plaintiff was suspected of merely committing an infraction. There was no need for Defendant 3 Officers to tackle, pile on, and/or punch Plaintiff, as she did not pose a physical threat to the 4 officers or the public and had not tried to flee or resist. Defendant officers' conduct was 5 excessive and unreasonable, which violated both their training and Plaintiff's constitutional 6 7 rights under the Fourth Amendment. 24. As a result of their misconduct, Defendants are liable for Plaintiff's injuries, 8 either because they were integral participants in the excessive force or because they failed to 9 10 intervene to prevent these violations. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for relief as hereinafter set forth. 11 JURY DEMAND 12 13 25. Plaintiff hereby demands a jury trial in this action. **PRAYER** 14 15 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for relief, as follows: 1. For general damages in a sum according to proof; 16 17 2. For special damages, including but not limited to past, present, and/or future wage loss, 18 income and support, medical expenses, and other special damages in a sum to be determined according by proof; 19 3. For punitive damages against Defendants Carpio, Tyler, Lucas, and DOES 1-50 in a sum 20 according to proof; 21 4. All other damages, penalties, costs, interest, and attorney fees as allowed by 42 U.S.C. 22 §§ 1983 and 1988, and as otherwise may be allowed by federal law against Defendants 23 Carpio, Tyler, and Lucas; 24 5. For cost of suit herein incurred; and 25
